<u>INSTITUTIONAL CHALLENGES</u>

- 1. The college faces financial strain due to rising prices and a lack of government endowment.
- 2. A significant portion of the next generation of students exhibits a lackadaisical attitude towards further studies.
- 3. Providing fee waivers for students from families affected by the economic repercussions of the pandemic strains the college's finances.
- 4. Early marriages in certain societal groups and rural areas contribute to student irregularity and academic disengagement.
- 5. Traditional family values discourage students from participating in internships, outreach programs, further studies, or seeking employment in other cities.
- 6. Many students are first-generation learners, resulting in a lack of support and certainty from their families.
- 7. The availability of private undergraduate degrees from UOK diminishes interest in attending regular college.
- 8. Students show more interest in nursing and veterinary nursing courses due to perceived job opportunities.
